Czech refugee Joe found a new life in post-war Rasen



placed during the war and after working under duress fortifying the German's position in France, came to Willingham Hall.

Now he has written a book, Steps in the Dark, documenting his experiences.

He said: "I had not planned to write the book, I wanted to forget everything, but my children told me: 'we know you as a father, but not as a man'.

"People that have read it tell me they couldn't put it down, but I can hardly remember what I wrote now."

Having settled in Market Rasen, Mr Willisch married his wife Elizabeth and had three daughters, Linda, Sandra and Jane.

The book took Mr Willisch several years to write and was compiled using notes he had made during and after his stay at Willingham Hall and historical fact.

But he said it was difficult to write about his life during and before the war as he had to work entirely from memory. He added: "I did not set out

He added: "I did not set out to gain financially, I wanted to write it for my family and it just got out of hand."

U3A explore the world of Victorian poverty

THEIR August meeting saw West Wolds U3A taken back to 1834, when the new Poor Law established the Poor Law Unions of local parishes to set up workhouses for the poorest in society.

National Trust volunteer
Colin Deeley gave a detailed
and interesting talk illustrated
by pictures of the workhouse
in Southwell, which has been
restored by the National Trust
back to its original interior.
Families were bathed on admission, had their clothes and any
possessions taken from them,
and then were separated, living
apart and given work according
to their ability, men breaking stones into dust, women

doing laundry, while children were taught under the strict tutelage of the overseeing schoolmaster.

He and his wife, the matron, had to instil discipline over the inmates under the jurisdiction of the guardians who administered the workhouse.

The workhouse at Southwell is open on Wednesdays to Sundays from noon to 5pm.
