SPEAKER PROGRAMME 2022

9th June 'Age UK - Get Involved!



Age UK Lindsey is an independent local charity, working to promote and improve the well-being of older people in East Lindsey, West Lindsey and North Lincolnshire. Katie and Lin will talk us through their initiatives and projects.

This year marks the 100 year anniversary of the opening of Tutankhamun's tomb by Howard Carter.

The talk describes the discovery of the tomb, its layout and the principal items found; and also what happened afterwards including the so-called 'Mummy's Curse'.

What are the key adaptations we gardeners must make to succeed in a less than perfect climate? Trevor is a fruit growing consultant and horticultural speaker, as well as finding time to be a volunteer gardener at Gunby Hall.

WHAT DOES YOUR MEMBERSHIP FEE PAY FOR?

Every u3a across the country pays a fee to the national office called 'Capitation'. It has increased this April to £4 per member, and for West Wolds this amounted to £1,248. So what do we get from national office for this fee? The one most people are aware of is **Insurance Cover** yet there is a general misconception as to what this really covers so here is a short overview:

Public Liability

Covers injury caused to a third-party or their property arising from a u3a activity. Members can be regarded as a third-party if they are injured as a result of an accident for which the u3a is legally liable.

Property

Covers damage to moveable items owned by the u3a and contents of a member's home whilst a u3a activity is hosted.

Cyber

This covers any costs involved following a data loss.

Money

This covers Theft of u3a money as a result of a break November. -in or during a u3a activity.

Apart from insurance, National office deliver training workshops, summer schools, advice and legal updates, procedures for committees to follow, an annual AGM, as well as regional conferences to exchange ideas and receive updates on future strategy, online learning events free to all members on diverse subjects (more info: https://www.u3a.org.uk/events/educational-events) Branded items and so on.

In addition, there is a fee for members to receive the Third Age Matters (TAM for short) Magazine at £3.35 per member which on current predictions will be invoiced shortly at approx. £800. Members can opt-out of receiving this publication if it is not required, or could share with another member, either option would make a saving to our u3a coffers (see below).

Finally there is a £1 per member fee to cover the costs of Beacon. This is the management system designed and implemented by u3a members which frees up a lot of time and effort for committees and streamlines many of the processes required to run a u3a.

So from your £17 standard single-membership rate*, there is £8.65 remaining to run West Wolds u3a on (*some members pay a reduced rate so we do not receive that from all members). The biggest outlay is the monthly general meeting with hall hire fees (which increased by 35% in April), speakers and refreshments. There are other costs of course, Neighbourhood fees, printing and postage generally and for the Newsletter, stationery, PAT testing, start-up grants for new groups and so on-the details are presented at the AGM each November.

What you also receive, apart from that mentioned above, is access to over 40 interest groups; providing not only the opportunity to learn or improve a skill or your health and wellbeing but a social setting to meet new and old friends and laugh, live, learn.

If you are still taking TAM and don't want to keep it after you have read it, why not bring it to the monthly meeting to recycle for another member to take it away and benefit too?

This was the most perfect way to spend a Sunday morning. It was such an informal arrangement, that we would be at the garden at 11.00am but with no fixed notion of actually meeting up. It was lovely to see so many members of the group there; some people whom I already knew and others whom I had seen before but never had the opportunity to speak to. We sat in the courtyard outside the old stable building, enjoying coffee, cake and good company in pleasant Spring sunshine.

I had no idea what to expect at Ashfield House and the garden was a complete surprise. I think I was anticipating the formality of borders and beds, all laid out in pristine fashion and properly labelled. Instead there was the most wonderful relaxed feeling of space, and room to wander amongst beautiful trees. The first area we came across was the cherry trees, 150 of them in 40 different varieties, standing in beautifully mown grass and surrounded by swathes of white daffodils. The blossom was beautiful, and even more so on a lovely morning with enough sunshine and blue sky to show it off. There were so many shades of white, pink and cream and even one where the blossom was a delicate shade of green. And the colour of the bark was amazing too. There were some which glowed smooth and red; absolutely irresistible. I just had to touch them.

Apart from the drifts of white daffodils, there were other areas dedicated to bluebells and fritillaries. The bluebells were promising but not yet in bloom. Fritillaries are always a joy to see. Another patch was full of primroses. Or perhaps they were primulas? By now I didn't mind what they were. The informality of the garden was getting to me. I was just at ease, walking beneath the trees and alongside the lake, watching a mallard with three fluffy ducklings. It was all so beautiful.

NEWS FROM YOUR MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

GIFT AID _ WHAT IS IT?

This is a Government Scheme to offer financial help to charities and is now commonly used by charities such as The National Trust, so when you join or renew your membership they invite you to 'signup for Gift Aid'. This means that if you pay a membership fee of say £50, 25% or 1/4 of that amount can be reclaimed by the charity from HMRC. Smaller charities have also taken advantage of this windfall and your u3a is no exception. It is the committee who have to reclaim the money, all you have to do, providing you are a taxpayer, is on your membership renewal form tick the box to say you are a taxpayer and then sign in the appropriate place. That's it - and we get 25% of your fee in addition. Please let Jane know if you are a UK taxpayer at any time and she will make the necessary arrangements.

BADGES

We are disappointed that very many of you do not wear your name badges at meetings. We know it is difficult for most of us to remember names of people who we do not see regularly, and it is so much nicer if we can call them by their name too.

We believe there are two main reasons for not wearing them, we forget to bring them with us, but more important 'what is the point' when we can't read them easily. The name is very small and there is a lot of other 'stuff' on the badge. We have therefore redesigned the badges and will introduce the new ones when you renew your membership in late summer/early autumn. As for those who forget to bring their badges—ladies keep them in your handbags and that way you should have them with you. Gentlemen—if you are coming with your wife ask her to put yours with hers. For those men who are on their own and for the ladies who regularly change their handbags—any suggestions are welcome!

LANYARDS

Generally our badges are ones we pin on, but your committee put theirs on blue lanyards and the convenors wear yellow ones; this is so you can more easily identify them. If any convenor needs a yellow lanyard, please contact me at a general meeting.

We hope that you will continue to support the monthly meetings where you can find out 'what's on', have a cuppa and a chat and hear a different subject speaker each month.




