THIS MONTH IN THE GARDEN

Probably not a great deal! Of course it very much depends on the weather. I will be tempted out if it is not too cold and dry and more so if the sun shines as well. There is much for me to do as I have neglected it rather since the last very cold spell when much died and flopped, such as my sedums, hollyhocks and dahlias. It seems there are leaves everywhere despite some earlier efforts. One of the things I will definitely be doing is mulching to stop the weeds from growing and protect precious plants from frost, especially my dahlias which I leave in the ground. I have found four bags of leaf mould hiding that needs spreading around too.

I will also clean up my tools and oil and sharpen them ready to use in coming months. I have bought several packets of seeds so I shall sort them into the months when I should plant them and make a New Year's resolution that I will do them on time too. I will regularly clean my bird bath and bird feeders and top them up too. I do love to see the birds enjoying the garden too.



Now is the best time to plant bare root roses and start chitting your potatoes and planting sweet peas if you can keep them protected in the green-house. If you grow hellebores cut off the old leaves to expose those pretty flowers which are coming into bloom.

You will know how I have been opening up some of our events to other neighbouring garden groups and this is a visit organised by the u3a group in Welton and they have now invited us to join them. I have had the pleasure of visiting Ashfield House in February to see the snowdrops and much more and would highly recommend this second visit. The 10 acre garden has sweeping lawns, trees and shrubs. It features mass plantings of spring flowering bulbs and recent additions include a Magnolia collection in a newly constructed woodland garden. The cost is £6 per person including tea/coffee and biscuits. Book as usual through Jane.
