

WW u3a GARDEN GROUP EXCURSION TO COTON MANOR GARDEN AND COTTESBROOKE HALL GARDEN ON WEDNESDAY, 24TH MAY, 2023

We are planning to visit two of the most beautiful gardens in our country. We will first visit Coton Manor Garden where we can enjoy our packed lunch or take a homemade lunch in the Stableyard café before making our way to Cottesbrooke Garden in the afternoon. Both are in Northamptonshire.

Coton Manor Garden was originally laid out in the 1920's by the grandparents of the present owner, the garden has been developed and extended by successive generations capitalising on its natural setting, attractive views and abundant water. The 17th century manor house acts as a central focus for the garden, its walls supporting many roses and shrubs, while the surrounding terraces are populated by numerous colourful pots and containers. The extensive nursery has over a thousand varieties of plants, many of which are unusual and are propagated from the garden.

Cottesbrooke House and Garden. These gardens, former winners of the coveted Christies and Historic Houses Association "Garden of the Year Award", are a constant source of innovation and development – from the formal gardens that surround the Hall and to the Wild Garden, which flanks a meandering stream where acers, spring bulbs and gunneras create a romantic and tranquil air.



The charge which includes coach travel, driver's tip and entrance to both gardens is £47.50.

Back last August, Trevor Rogers, a professional horticulturist and specialist fruit grower and volunteer gardener at Gunby Hall, was the guest speaker at our general meeting. He was inspiring and passionate about his work at Gunby Hall and a number of our members said they wanted to go there. There are 8 acres of Victorian walled gardens with kitchen garden, wildflower areas and wonderful borders bursting with colourful plants and flowers which is worth a visit in every season.

We have therefore booked a coach to go towards the end of the summer. Gunby Hall is a homely, country house built in 1700 for the Massingberd family who lived there for more than 250 years. It is now run by the National Trust. The estate comprises 1,500 acres of pleasant countryside still representing a lowland farming estate where nature thrives and features lots of permissive paths for relaxing scenic walks.

There is a cosy tea-room located in the former laundry building with seating in the courtyard, serving sandwiches, snacks, hot/cool drinks and sweet treats.


