WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Garden Group visit to "Overbeck" garden.

On Wednesday, July 5th our group visited "Overbeck" in Scothern belonging to John and Joyce Good. This garden represents a 29 year project of design and hard work. Joyce was kind enough to show us an album which depicted the gradual creation of what is now a plantsman's garden. See photographs "Before and After!" from no flower beds at all to today's magnificent plantings. We were free to wander at will.



We entered over the Beck into a good sized area, mature shrubs and small trees screening the dormer bungalow from the road; the flower beds here curved and colour-themed. Α central circular flower bed was a riot of colour. (see pic' on the left). walking down the side of the property we passed clematis and roses at the back corner of the bungalow and entered the large and carefully designed rear gardens. Passing a bed of various grasses a central lawn was flanked by huge curving beds of Perennials.

The ground sloped gently upwards towards a small pond stocked with goldfish. A stone bird bath and rustic stone figure set off this delightful

feature which also boasted gorgeous bright pink Waterlilies.

On our left, slightly hidden behind a small paved "room" with an antique Urn, was the surprise geometric feature of clipped Box (photos here) and to the right a white bed. On the extreme right a pleasant grassed seating area was tastefully arranged to include ornamental sculptured Ducks and Chickens.

At the rear behind a screen of roses and climbers of all kinds lay the immaculate vegetable garden. The screen had been created from a badly positioned pergola that the original owners had erected 30yrs previously.

After a sojourn on a recliner in the shade, it was back to the house where we were served with tea, coffee or a cold drink with a biscuit.

James Alexander-Sinclair FSGD is one of the foremost garden designers in the United Kingdom. He has designed gardens from Cornwall to the Western Isles and from London to Moscow. He is a full member of the Society of Garden Designers. He is also an award winning writer, a compelling speaker, frequent broadcaster and served ten years as a member of the Council of the Royal Horticultural Society. He is an RHS Vice-President and was awarded the Veitch Memorial Medal for outstanding contribution to horticulture in 2022. He is the RHS Ambassador for Garden Design and a Fellow of the Society of Garden Designers.

He has given talks in Russia, China, Canada, Europe and the USA as well as at garden societies the length and breadth of this country.

He served a decade (2011-2021) as a trustee of the Royal Horticultural Society. James is an accredited RHS Gardens judge and is a member of the RHS Gardens Committee, the Community Action Group and the Shows Advisory Group.

Internationally, James helped to set up the Moscow Flower Show in 2012 and has also judged gardens in the USA and China.
