WHAT'S COMING?

November meeting with Peter Williams talking about "Special Plants for Small Gardens".

Peter Williams is a retired plant scientist with specialist knowledge of plant ecology, physiology and soil microbiology. He is a lifelong gardener and for many years ran a small nursery that specialised in the propagation of trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants, especially those for acid soils and woodland environments. He now writes

about gardening matters for the Hardy Plant Journal and gives talks both locally and nationally and occasionally opens his garden at Weathervane House for charitable organisations.

Having a small garden can be a real asset so long as the plants are well chosen. This talk looks briefly at aspects of small garden design and suggests plants that really earn their keep in a limited space. It covers small trees, shrubs, herbs and bulbs both for use in the soil and planters. It also contains a number of short diversions to look briefly at special people, plants and topical issues.

Peter has sent me a list of plants he is recommending as a handout. This is attached to this newsletter.
