



#### WHAT DOES YOUR MEMBERSHIP FEE PAY FOR?

Every u3a across the country pays a fee to the national office for membership. It increased in April 2022 to £4 per member, and for West Wolds this is likely to cost for 2023-24 £1,216. So what do we get from national office for this fee?

The one most people are aware of is Insurance Cover yet there is a general misconception as to what this really covers so here is a short overview:

**Public Liability** Covers injury caused to a thirdparty or their property arising from a u3a activity. Members can be regarded as a third-party if they are injured as a result of an accident for which the u3a is legally liable.

**Property** Covers damage to moveable items owned by the u3a and contents of a member's home whilst a u3a activity is hosted.

**Cyber** This covers any costs involved following a data loss.

**Money** This covers Theft of u3a money as a result of a break-in or during a u3a activity.

Apart from insurance, National office deliver training workshops, summer schools, advice and legal updates, procedures for committees to follow, an annual AGM, as well as regional conferences to exchange ideas and receive updates on future strategy, online learning events free to all members on diverse subjects (more info: https:// www.u3a.org.uk/learning/learningactivities and https://www.u3a.org.uk/events/ educational-events) Branded items and so on. In addition, there is a fee for members to receive the Third Age Matters (TAM for short) Magazine at  $\pounds$ 3.60 per member which on current predictions will be invoiced shortly at approx.  $\pounds$ 500. Members can opt-out of receiving this publication if it is not required, or could share with another member, either option would make a saving to our u3a coffers (see below).

Finally there is a £1 per member fee to cover the costs of Beacon. This is the management system designed and implemented by u3a members which frees up a lot of time and effort for committees and streamlines many of the processes required to run a u3a. So from your £18 standard single-membership rate\*, there is £9.65 remaining to run West Wolds u3a on (\*some members pay a reduced rate so we do not receive that from all members). The biggest outlay is the monthly general meeting with hall hire fees (which increased by 35% in April 2022), speakers and refreshments. There are other costs of course, Neighbourhood fees, printing and postage generally and for the Newsletter, stationery, PAT testing, start-up grants for new groups and so onthe details are presented at the AGM each November. What you also receive, apart from that mentioned above, is access to over 40 interest groups; providing not only the opportunity to learn or improve a skill or your health and wellbeing but a social setting to meet new and old friends and laugh, live, learn.

## A.I. IN OUR LIVES



Our new Artificial Intelligence (AI) group will be holding face to face meetings at New Life Church in Market Rasen from September. We're taking a short break right now due to the need for our Group Leader to take it easy for a bit following doctors' advice.

In this month's edition of our information page you'll find interesting information about the wealth of Online Learning Events available to all u3a members. Either google Online Learning Events u3a or head straight to the national website. They cover a range of topics and there's something there for everyone without the need to step outside you own home.

#### AI Subject Adviser

The u3a now has a national subject adviser, Barry Claydon, who has put together a library of articles on various topics and levels. This is available to every u3a member and can be found on the national u3a website. It's regularly updated and crammed with good information. It contains articles for absolute beginners and experts alike.

#### **Interest Groups Online (IGO)**

If you can't make a time for our own AI group you can join an AI group online. To do this you need to join IGO as a separate group. The cost is £12 for a full year (renewable every April). At the moment they're running monthly groups of four sessions aimed at people who are starting out on their AI journey. This Introductory Course gives you a gentle introduction into the world of AI. Entitled AI for Everyone, the course covers four topics including Generative AI, Fake News -What Is It?, Bots, Apps and More, Society.

#### West Wolds - Another First

Our u3a AI group is the first in Lincolnshire, however more are currently being planned. Very soon we'll be joined by a group in Sleaford and there are many u3as who are already developing groups to link AI with Science and Technology or advances in Photography, Art or Computing. Some groups are specifically looking at discussion and ethical issues while others are exploring the technical aspects in more depth.

#### AI for Everyone

Come along to the u3a Festival at York University in July (18th - 20th) and meet a range of enthusiasts at the AI Stand. I've already agreed to be there with Barry to demonstrate some of the things that are happening with Language. planning a mix of topics rather like our own group.



# WEST WOLDS U3A GARDEN GROUP **EXCURSION TO LITTLETHORPE MANOR,** NR. RIPON ON THURSDAY, 30<sup>TH</sup> MAY, 2024

This is perhaps the loveliest garden I have ever visited so I am very pleased to be able to take our Garden Group there at a wonderful time of the year.



The garden is on two levels - an upper level of 4 acres around the house, fairly formal in layout, with 7 acres of parkland below. The design is not an attempt at an historical recreation, but more the creation of a garden sympathetic to the Manor and its surrounds. On the upper level, a series of four gardens with different themes are linked together by repeated use of the same hard landscape materials and key structural planting (Hornbeam, Yew and Box hedging, with Bergenia, Luzula and Hakonechloa groundcover). A path running from the stable block to the drive links the gardens together via the Holly walk, Pergola and Fountain lawn.



The heart of the estate is the walled garden, reflecting Mrs Thackray's desire to relate the four seasons to the cycle of life. In the centre is Ygdrassil, the Norwegian World Tree - the symbolic Tree of Life. The circular features here are repeated as a theme throughout the garden.



The gardens around the house are increasingly formal. The Sunken garden parterre is based upon the White Rose of York emblem, the clipped box and trelliswork combining well with the white rendered Manor house. The main formal axis of the garden, from the terrace down to the classical pavilion, reflects Mr Thackray's ambition to create a 'mini arcadia'. To the front of the house, the new drive introduces a more contemporary feel, but still repeating the same key plants, materials and circular motifs.
