



Getting to Grips with Copilot



Microsoft Copilot is an AI powered chatbot that you'll find on many devices these days. It's similar to Google Gemini and many others. It has the ability to search and retrieve information, generate text, provide summaries and create information quickly. You can use text to create images in a range of styles. It will also translate languages, and if you're technically minded, it can provide code in programming languages such as Java Script and Python.

Many of us have already "dipped our toes" into the world of AI in different ways and it's fair to say that this world is changing very quickly indeed. You may have come across a range of Apps and devices already and are happy to see where all of this is leading. On the other hand, you may already feel overwhelmed by the speed at which technology is now moving.

Whether you're a beginner or an improver don't forget that we have our own West Wolds AI group and there's also plenty of support from the AI Subject Adviser, Barry Claydon on the u3a website

Planning a Holiday with Copilot



Whichever chatbot you're familiar with you can use it to plan a trip. I started doing just that last year when I first discovered ChatGTP. Now with Copilot I decided to have another go. It's fair to say that AI has moved on in leaps and bounds since then. The conversational style of the Microsoft version of this AI-powered conversational chat interface known as Copilot can be very intoxicating and it's easy to think it's a sophisticated human. This isn't the case and if you apply your own common sense you won't go wrong. With all things it's sensible to do your own research correctly and check your facts with other sources of information, experts in the field and the Internet.

I asked Copilot how I would plan a holiday. It came back with a comprehensive list of advice that included three suggestions for foreign travel including Greece, North America and Spain with a little bit of additional detail for each location.

The rest of the advice focussed on a set of sensible travel tips that included seeking appropriate information from relevant bodies such as travel operators, Gov.uk and the like. The good thing about Copilot is that it now gives a list of additional sites to acquire useful information-something that Bard, Bing and ChatGPT didn't do in the past.

To test it out further I tried three places that I knew pretty well. You'll find these in the box to the left. In all three cases Copilot gave me a distinct feel for the places and the types of activities I might choose to undertake while spending time there. Once you have a skeleton idea in your mind you can ask Copilot for additional advice.

The important thing to remember in all of this is never to supply personal information just as you wouldn't with any other site on the Internet unless you were happy to do this. Try asking the question "What's my name?" Copilot will give you a sensible answer that may include a response stating that Copilot doesn't have access to this type of information. Remember that you're the human: you're in charge!

THE STORY BEHIND THE BEEHIVE!

Looking like bees themselves, in their hi-viz jackets, 17 members of West Wolds U3a, landed in Thornes of Wragby on Wednesday 24th April. They were met by Rebecca Coleman, granddaughter of the founder of the company.

their skills, including their use of a machine previously used by Rebecca Moving out to the rear of the main building we began to realize the

On the face of it, the company which is sited in a beautifully landscaped estate, simply sells items of beekeeping equipment, and some honey. In reality, this is far from the truth as the group soon learned.



We were given a detailed history of the creation and development of the company, which started locally in 1913, when Edgar Henry Thorne, a local joiner, was asked by the head master of a local Wragby school, to make him a beehive. There followed many more requests for the hives, and in due course a small business was formed, eventually leading to the current organization which has four retail outlets, one in Scotland and three in England. Locally Thornes employ over 100 staff on it 20 acre site. During the recent Covid epidemic the company came near to closure, however Government reassurances to support businesses, encouraged the Directors to soldier on and surprisingly there was a huge surge in demand due to the movement restrictions placed on the population. This resulted in one of the best periods of sales experienced by the company.



Following this introduction, the group moved upstairs to a specialist production unit making protective

clothing for beekeepers, handmade by an enthusiastic team of local ladies who were very keen to show us their skills, including their use of a 50 year old sewing machine previously used by Rebecca's mother.

Moving out to the rear of the main building we began to realize the surprising size of this enterprise. We visited the workshops for metal and woodworking, followed by the assembly areas where all the component parts were brought together.



In another, specially designed processing unit, wax brought in from beekeepers from around the country, and overseas, was melted, purified and eventually

rolled into a continuous sheet only millimetres thick. This formed the basis for the bees to build their honeycombs upon. Finally, we returned to the shop, where all the items we had seen being produced, were on show.



By now we were quite fatigued and thirsty! The last production area was in sight'- that of the "Buzz Stop Café"! We were all impressed by the factory areas, however we were overcome by the products flowing from this department! The tea and cakes which followed were of such outstanding quality and quantity, that many of us have decided to use it for West Wolds u3a groups on many future occasions—we will of course make a bee-line for it!

Thanks are due to Rebecca Coleman (Director) and Gill Smith (Managing Director) for allowing the visit and making us so welcome—we will be back!


