SECRETARY'S NOTEBOOK - JUNE

<u>U3A INSURANCE -</u> WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?



The Third Age Trust provides all u3a's with Public Liability Insurance, which covers legal liability for injury to a third party, or the property of a third party, which has arisen as a result of a u3a activity. It should be noted however that there is no cover for PERSONAL INJURY.

Summarised below are details of what the Policy will cover.

Property

Moveable items owned by the u3a are covered. Moveable items could be a laptop, speakers, PA, screen etc. All property must be kept safe whether at a venue or at home. If held at a venue, items must be stored in a lockable cupboard where no one else can use it. In a member's home, the same cover applies providing it has arisen during any u3a activity.

Money

Cash up to 1k is covered during any activity or at a members home, or during transit. Reasonable care must be taken to keep it safe.

Cyber

Data loss - the costs involved dealing with a security breach

Cyber crime - cover for theft of u3a money Liability - a third party can claim compensation for any loss as a result of a data breach.

There are conditions relating to cyber cover: individuals must have their own passwords with no sharing; back ups must be made and stored separately from the original data; personal and sensitive data must be stored and disposed of securely; there must be a firewall and anti-virus software and both kept up to date.

FAQ's

1. Can a non-member attend an outing. The underwriter feels if someone wants to take advantage of our trips, they should be a member. However, we say people can come to a taster session so in theory they could go on one outing maximum. Taking numerous non-members to fill a

coach, this is prohibited. A policy has being written stating that a non-member may attend 3 taster sessions, which includes 1 trip only. Carers may attend groups/ meetings free of charge and may attend on a trip but have to pay for their place. If on a trip, they cannot 'split up' and must remain with the person they are accompanying. A carer can be a friend or relative, they don't have to be paid or registered.

2. Can dogs attend a walk.

Only if all the group members and leader agree and the dog is kept on a lead at all times. There should be a Risk Assessment stating if crossing farmland containing livestock, it may be inappropriate to allow dogs.

3. Reporting accidents and incidents

There is a 3 year deadline to bring a claim for injury and 6 years for damage, so every accident or incident should be recorded asap afterwards as if the claim comes in a long time after the event, noone will recall the circumstances. Group Leaders need to be aware of this. One trustee will be responsible for keeping them and backed up. It is recommended that Group Leaders keep attendance registers and hold on to them or pass to the Groups Coordinator to avoid a fraudulent claim being made.

4. Holidays

No holidays should be organised unless through a Tour Operator with proper liability insurance.

5. Risk Assessments

All activities should have a check-list (or RA) and kept in case of a future claim. For example, a walking leader should advise what the terrain will be like etc, then individuals know what equipment and clothing may be required. Individuals should make their own judgement about their abilities to complete any activity.





Our flagship group is for those who have been studying Spanish for a while and who already know a good range of language through travel and time spent in a Spanish speaking country. This group is full.


Spanish Conversation and Scrabble (Vamos a **Juntarnos**)

LINCOLNSHIRE AVIATION HERITAGE CENTRE VISIT - EAST KIRKBY

Despite slight rain and an overcast sky, 10 members of West Wolds u3a were able to enjoy a very interesting day at the Lincolnshire Aviation Heritage Centre at East Spilsby, on the 14th May. The site, based on a WWII Lancaster bomber airfield, now houses a vast collection of aviation equipment and documentation. We were able to visit buildings such as the Control Tower, the Radio Room, the Military Transport room (previously the MT Section) and the NAAFI, and embrace the life of the Royal Air Force personnel who occupied the airfield during the war. The main hangar, once used to house the bombers, still functions, not only as a museum of aviation items, but also continues its' manufacturing role, as a Lancaster fuselage is being lovingly rebuilt there, by local enthusiasts.





The purpose of both the personnel and the buildings was to support the Lancaster and Mosquito aircraft that were based there at the time. Whilst the aircraft no longer fly regularly, the highlight of our visit was to see both aircraft start up and taxy out onto the airfield. Regrettably, the Mosquito had an engine problem and was unable to taxy, however some of us stayed on and were able to see the Lancaster perform twice! The Lancaster is an impressive aircraft to watch on startup, as each engine was brought to life, until finally all four were Dave Ebbage



ready for work. After a short taxy out onto the grass airfield, the aircraft turned and the engines were brought to maximum power to simulate take off. Unlike the whine of modern jet aircraft, the Lancaster creates a crescendo of pulsing sound as the individual engine vibrations interlock and then separate to form low pitched pulses. The sight of multiple formation take-offs must have been awesome for eye and ear!

The group was also fortunate to see a collection of Morgan sport cars that were gathered for the day as part of their annual meet up. The finale for them was to be photographed in front of the Lancaster, marking what must have been a memorable day for their members. All too soon the day came to a close, but not before the delights of the NAAFI were sampled. Gladly, there were no spam fritters or corned beef sandwiches, so we finished the day by sampling a wide range of cakes, savouries and drinks before returning to Market Rasen.



East Spilsby is open throughout the year and offers a wide range of facilities. The highlight for real aviation enthusiasts must be to be on the Lancaster whilst the aircraft is being taxied, and this is available starting at £495 for the whole day visit; something to save for!
