GIFT AID

Now we are in the thick of Membership (New and Renewals), it is an opportune time to remind you of the benefits of Gift Aid.

What is Gift Aid? Everyone who pays income tax can get their donation to charity (that's your membership fee to us) boosted by 25% if you agree to Gift Aid. All you have to do is declare you are a tax payer and give your name and home or email address on the membership form each year. Common misconceptions we can dispel: The tax man does not want a self-assessment form and will not come knocking at your door or check your records; and we do not have any access to your income or tax status. All HMRC want to know is do you pay tax?

If you are a taxpayer and currently do not sign up for Gift Aid, please may I ask you to do so? As our expenditure increases there may come a time in the not-too-distant future where we have to increase Membership to cover costs. Based on this year's figures and without Gift Aid claimed, the membership would have to increase by £3 resulting most probably in a decrease in membership.



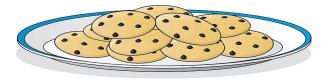

The Winter Bowls Programme will be starting in September.



Tickets will go on sale at the October and November meetings.




VISIT TO TATTERSHALL THORPE CENTRE

A crash at Heathrow Airport, a loop in a Tornado, a bombing run over Berlin and the demolition of a German dam-all before lunch!



Not quite, but all done in Virtual Reality (VR) at the Thorpe Camp Simulator, by four trainee pilots of U3A West Wolds. This was the third visit by our members and was every bit as successful as the previous two. Nobody was grounded and we were able to experience virtual flights on a Tornado F3, sitting in the ejector seat of a genuine cockpit, surrounded by your own airborne office. Other flights were in the less agile Lancaster, Spitfire and Jet Provost, with varying degrees of success failure.



The Centre is slowly building its range of simulator flights as well as its collection of aviation hardware, making it an interesting aviation site to visit. 


